Before you begin your application look through these instructions and make sure you have gathered the following information in order to complete your application:

- GCSE Certificates showing grades and examining boards
- Any other qualifications, including those taken overseas
- Details of any paid employment (i.e. employers name and address and the date you started/finished)
- If you were not born in the UK, date you entered.
- Credit/debit card to pay online application fee of £27.00 for up to five choices or £22.50 for one choice
- 15 October by 6.00pm: Deadline for most medicine, dentistry, veterinary science and Oxford and Cambridge (Internal College Deadline – Friday 30 September)
- 25 January by 6.00pm: Final UCAS deadline (Internal College Deadline Friday 30 November: A Level, BTEC, Access and other one year courses)

Personal statement *

Your completed statement must be between 1,000 and 4,000 characters (maximum 47 lines) including spaces.

UCAS' similarity detection service: every personal statement is run through software to check for plagiarism.

Review and Submit

When you have completed all sections of your application and it shows 100% completed you will be able to review and submit from 6 September 2022. You will be asked for online payment at this stage.

Make sure that your application is complete and free from errors – make sure that you have it checked by your tutor or a member of the Careers Team.

It is your responsibility to check that the correct information is on your application form.



Once you have submitted your application, it will be released to the college to ensure that your reference and predicted grades are added.

References & Predicted Grades

- A reference is a written recommendation from your teachers outlining your academic abilities and suitability for study at Higher Education.
- Predicted grades are not your target grades.
- Predicted grades are provided by your teachers these grades are not negotiable.
- Predicted grades are awarded from teachers based on your performance in lessons and assessments. They will be using their professional judgement based on evidence.

Final Checks

- Once you have submitted your application to us, your application will be given a final check.
- If there are errors, your application will be sent back to you to make the amendments.
- ✤ You will need to resubmit your application to us you will not be required to pay again!
